

Haiku is the shortest form of poetry in the world!

A haiku is a traditional Japanese poem made up of three short lines that capture a moment, image or feeling.

The traditional form has 17 syllables:

Line 1 has **5 syllables**.

Line 2 has 7 syllables.

Line 3 has 5 syllables.

A length of 17 syllables is <u>not an absolute rule</u> for haiku. Some haiku are even shorter and some have a few extra syllables. All haiku are brief and expressive.

Haiku are described as:

- a sensory passing experience,
- reflecting a moment concisely,
- distilling a human experience into a very short poem, or
- a moment to reflect, a sense of wonder.
